We have opened our national trial to recruitment and we now have recruited over 150 people into our



study. We want to thank you to all our recruiting sites for their continued hard work. We are also working on bringing DIAMONDS to a wider range of people. We have been working closely with the Ethnic Minority Research Inclusion network to translate our workbook and study materials into Urdu. Together we are looking at ways to make research summaries and infographics available in different languages. Thank you to Roshni Ghar who have been been helping and supporting us in this project.

Also, we have been busy writing papers and presenting at conferences. We have published a paper on the steps we took to create the DIAMONDS intervention, which is available in the Journal of Medical Internet Research. We have also been spreading the word, in March our programme manager presented at the Leeds and York Partnership Foundation Trust event 'Research for all' and in June, as part of the York Festival of Ideas, we hosted a panel discussion on physical and mental health.
