In spite of the set backs of the Covid years it hasn't stopped the determination of the Diamonds Team to see the programme through. What a year it has been! What with the completion of the Diamonds Feasibility study and then with agreement from the NIHR sponsors meant that the Diamonds Intervention could proceed to a National Trial. After a lot of collaborative work, negotiation and no doubt some sleepless nights too, there are now several NHS sites currently open to recruitment to the Diamonds Randomised Control Trial (RCT)

We would like to thank everyone in Diamonds Voice who have been incredibly valuable in supporting us with the UCLP-Primrose project (development of both the intervention and research) and share a short progress update. [For those who might not have been involved yet, UCLP-Primrose is an integrated service for patients with severe mental illness, to support those at risk of cardiovascular disease. We are about 8 months in - Diamonds Voice have been a huge help with their input on some of the adapted materials (such as a patient facing booklet and training video scripts), UCL Partners have now created most of the materials needed to train and support staff to deliver UCLP-Primrose, with only a few training videos left to film [stay tuned for these]. Initial training sessions started in November, and clinicians across the participating sites in Bradford and London will receive the full training in the New Year. You can see their website to see the materials and read more about the intervention.

UCL and Bradford's Improvement Academy are researching how UCLP-Primrose is getting set up and delivered. Diamonds Voice have supported us to develop the processes to involve patients in our research as well as informing amendments to patient facing research documents - we have ethics approval and have started with our clinician interviews! Additionally, the UCL website is being updated in line with Diamonds Voice suggestions such as creating a space for more information for patient participants which will include accessible versions of documents.

Finally, Diamonds Voice members have been joining the UCLP-Primrose team as public contributors in meetings across the research theme of multiple-long term conditions. This has and will continue to be important to sharing learnings from across national projects.

We are really grateful for the work we have been able to do with Diamonds Voice so far, and we are keen to keep working with you. We will be in touch in the New Year!
